
A Trip Over the County by a Times Man 3-22-12 By W. G. Burchard.

While on our trip over the Sweeny section of the country we met no more hospitable people than Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Brockman who came here but a short time ago from Ray County Mo. Mr. Brockman has 100 acres of fine peach ridge land and is rapidly getting it under cultivation. Every foot of it was covered with the typicel growth of the Bernard bettoms, and required much labor to bring it usaier cultivation. Just at dack we reached their hospitable home. Here we spent the night, and greatly regretted to see the time come for our leaving the next morning. good people are deserving of all and more than any country can give them.

## The Brockman & Arrington names are associated with dry goods stores in Sweeny & several other nearby locations.

### HISTORICAL RESEARCH

• Sept. 1910 John C Brockman (Creel Sr.) buys 100 acres adjacent to Rimmer's property south of town. Wife Molly makes several property buys in town over the next few years. There is no evidence Creel Sr. or wife was involved in the Sweeny or any other store.

1919 Creel Brockman Jr. and J G Arrington buy the Kimmey building and lots from Rimmer. We already know that Rimmer, Hankins and Riley first owned the lots, built the building and owned the store.

- Somewhere around 1920-1921 Brockman and Co. is formed. This being Creel Jr. and J G Arrington as well as their wife Willie and Mary. So we have J G and Mary Arrington, daughter Willie and son in law Creel Jr.
- 1920-1921 Brockman and Co. buy L A Riley's store on lots 5, 6 and 7, block 39 except the kitchen. Did not chase this out from here. Along this same timeframe Brockman Co. sells the Kimmey lots and building to Hankins.
- 1923 C. A. Brockman buys Kimmey lots and building from Hankins and keeps until he sells to Kimmey in 1931.
- At some point it appears that J G and Mary Arrington bought a store in West Columbia located lower story of the Masonic building in block 8. In 1923 they bequeath this property to Creel Jr. and Willie. It's possible that Creel and Willie were in on this property from the beginning(no further research done). If so the purchase must have been before Brockman Co. was formed.
- Brockman Co. buy property in Freeport somewhere around 1927. Creel and Willie also bought a lot in Freeport around this time.
- Around 1930 it gets really muddy. It appears by this time Creel and Willie have moved to New Gulf, apparently with ½ the Freeport merchandise and started a store there. The partnership is dissolved and the Arrington's get the Freeport store and Creel and Willie the New Gulf store.
- It is assumed Creel and Willie maintained ownership of West Columbia store for years to come.

He served as the Angleton Chamber of Commerce President, Brazoria County United Way President, and the Angleton Rotary Club President, where he touted 56 years of perfect attendance. One of Jay's final community service roles was with the Angleton for Better Living Committee that worked to pass the 403B tax and helped to build the Angleton Rec Center.

Dad, Uncle Jay, Daddy Jay, Mr. Brockman... many names, many hats all of a Godly man who loved his Lord, his family and his community. He gave of his time, his talents and his resources to many. He loved to sing and brag about his grandchildren. He was known in Wildcat Stadium as the "Everybody Up" guy. He was an entrepreneur, business owner and employer to many. Jay enjoyed deer hunting with the family, seashell hunting with Perk. He was an avid photographer and loved to play golf.
